

1. LNUPE at a glance

1.1 HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT

- 1.1.1 The Lakshmibai National University of Physical Education, Gwalior was established by the Ministry of Education & Culture, Government of India as Lakshmibai College of Physical Education (LCPE) In August 1957, the centenary year of the War of Independence and located at Gwalior, where Rani Lakshmibai of Jhansi, a valiant heroine of the war, had laid down her life during the first freedom struggle in 1857.
- 1.1.2 The Institute started as an affiliated college of the Vikram University, Ujjain and then came to the folds of Jiwaji University, Gwalior in 1964. The Institute was given the status of National importance, and hence it was renamed as Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE) In 1973. In recognition of its unique status and character and to facilitate its further growth, the college was conferred the status of an 'Autonomous College' of Jiwaji University, Gwalior in 1982.
- 1.1.3 In further recognition of the unique educational services rendered by the institute in the field of Physical Education, Sports and Research, the Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development conferred the status of a "Deemed to be University" in September 1995. Hence, University was again renamed as Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE). The Institute is the first "**Deemed to be University**" in the field of Physical Education in India and enjoys a unique place of its kind in South Asia. On 14 Jan'09, the Institute was renamed as Lakshmibai National University of Physical Education (LNUPE) under Section 3 of U.G.C. Act, 1965.
- 1.1.4 The main purpose of establishing this University was to upgrade the status of Physical Education by producing quality teachers and leaders through graduate and post-graduate courses, for the first time in the country. Three years Bachelor of Physical Education (BPE) was started in 1957 & two years Master of Physical Education (MPE) in 1963. In 1980, the then college reached yet another milestone and became the first institution in India to have offered one-year programme of Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in Physical Education. The Institute also admits candidates for Ph.D. on regular as well as part-time basis. Students are also admitted for various certificate/diploma/PG Diploma courses in different disciplines of Physical Education and Sports.
- 1.1.5 The duration of the Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.E.) course was initially of three years. To bring it at par with other professional degree courses, as also match the International standards the duration of the course was extended to four years integrated course and the course was renamed as Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed.) Integrated. The National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE). Western Regional Centre, Bhopal vide their Order No. WRC/5-6/6/90/2006/C-5370 dated 26th December 2006 accorded recognition to this course.

1.2 CAMPUS

- 1.2.1 The Lakshmibai National University of Physical Education (LNUPE) campus is known as Shaktinagar and located on Mela Road, at a distance of about one kilometer from Gwalior Railway Station. Gwalior is situated on Agra-Mumbai National highway and is on the main North-South rail route, about 320 Km from New Delhi.

- 1.2.2 University campus covers an area of about 153 acres and is fully residential. The University has main building consists of class rooms, laboratories, research block, auditorium & administrative block. A state of the art Library building with all modern facilities is available in the campus for use of staff, students, researchers and others. It has seven boys hostels & two girls hostels, separate mess for boys and girls, health center, an indoor swimming pool, Indore cricket pitch, two indoor gymnasium complexes, judo hall, table tennis hall, weight lifting & weight training halls, squash racket court, air Conditioned Auditorium and Unique Multipurpose Hall. The University has well laid play fields for outdoor games and sports. The University's library is stocked with professional books and literatures. It subscribes to several professional and research journals/magazines/periodicals and is undoubtedly the best of its kind in India. The research laboratories are also well equipped with modern and sophisticated equipments to cater to the scholarly thirst and needs of the students. University also runs a UGC Academic Staff College to conduct orientation and refresher courses for in-service teachers from all over the country.
- 1.2.3 The campus has sufficient number of residential quarters to house its faculty, officers and other employees. The campus also has a fully furnished guest house, a facility center, a Bank with ATM and a Post Office.

1.3 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the University are as under:

- 1.3.1 To prepare highly qualified teachers and leaders in the field of Physical Education and Sports.
- 1.3.2 To serve as a center of excellence and innovation in Physical Education and Sports.
- 1.3.3 To provide professional and academic leadership to other institutions in the field of Physical Education.
- 1.3.4 To provide vocational guidance and placement services to the professionals in this field.
- 1.3.5 To promote mass-participation in Physical Education and sports.
- 1.3.6 To develop and promote programmes of Physical Education and sports in the country.
- 1.3.7 To encourage and produce scientific contemporary literature in the field of Physical Education and sports.
- 1.3.8 To provide community services in the field of Physical Education and sports.

1.4 COURSES OFFERED

The University offers/plans to offer courses as per details given in various departments of the University. In this regard, kindly see the information given in each department.

1.5 HOSTELS AND MESS

It is mandatory for all the students perusing full-time courses to reside in the hostels and take their meals in the mess. A booklet containing rules and regulations regarding discipline and conduct in the University's hostel and mess is given to the students at the time of admission.

NOTE:-

- I Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited/ banned in the University campus as per the government orders and existing laws. Any body found indulging in ragging shall be strictly dealt with existing laws. **As per the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the**

authority, the concerned students shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the University.

- II For maintaining peace, tranquility and for disciplinary reasons, no one shall be permitted to keep any motor vehicle in the Hostel. Violation of this rule shall invite severe punishment to the extent of expulsion from the University.

1.6 HEALTH CENTRE

The University Health Centre provides treatment on a nominal fee for ordinary injuries and ailments under the supervision of resident doctors. Physiotherapy treatment for sports related injuries is also available. In case of emergency, the students are referred to the government approved hospitals for further treatment. In such cases, they will have to pay the cost of treatment. Medical officers/wardens are authorized to sign on behalf of the parents/guardians for administration of anesthesia or any form of medical treatment involving risk in an emergency. All students are required to follow the University's rules regarding health and medical services. Students are also insured under group accident cum medical claim policy.

1.7 CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITES

The University promotes cultural and literary activities through Cultural Club and Literary Society for the students by providing them an opportunity to participate in dramatics, Music, debates, symposia, quiz competition etc. The students are also involved extensively in activities like NCC, NSS, Camping and Adventure programmes to develop leadership qualities and all-round personality.

1.8 SPORTS PARTICIPATION

Competitive Sports are integral part of academic programme of the University. After attaining the status of Deemed to be a University, the University teams directly participate in the Inter-Varsity Tournaments in various games and sports. The University teams also participate in Gwalior District, M.P. State, other invitation/recognized competitions as per its policy.

1.9 ADMISSION AND RESRVATIONS

The Institute is co-educational and admits candidates from all over India as well as from foreign countries. For all courses, 15% seats are reserved for Scheduled Castes, 7.5% for scheduled Tribes, and 9% for OBC subject to the availability of eligible candidates. Directives issued by the Government of India from time to time regarding policy on reservation for SC/ST/OBC candidates are followed by the University.

1.10 APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

The cost of Prospectus is Rs. 500/-. Each application for admission in any course must be in the prescribed form attached with this Prospectus and sent to the Registrar, LNUPE under registered cover or handed over personally at the University Office before the last date mentioned against each course. The application should be completed in all respects and accompanied by the necessary documents without which it may be rejected. **The application should be accompanied with a Demand Draft of Rs. 200/- only as processing cum testing fee in favour of Registrar, LNUPE and payable at Gwalior. If the Application Form downloaded from the Website, it should be accompanied with a Demand Draft of Rs. 700/- only as a cost of Prospectus cum testing fee in favour of Registrar LNUPE, and payable at Gwalior.**

1.11 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

All eligible candidates (as per the requirement of particular course) should report for the admission test to the respective test center at their own. Further, the details of admission procedure for each course run by various departments of the University is described under the heading of particular department. No admission shall be granted to any candidate after 14th August 2010.

1.12 FOREIGN CANDIDATES

Foreign candidates applying under cultural exchange programme or in personal capacity shall be admitted on the basis of their credentials, attainment of minimum qualifying marks in admission test and meeting acceptable standards in medical examination. Foreign students must register themselves and pay fee by 14th August 2010. No admission shall be granted to any foreign candidate after 14th August 2010.

1.13 GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

The following conditions of admission shall apply to all the candidates seeking admission in different courses:-

- 1.13.1 Candidates expelled from any other board/Institute/University or dismissed from Government service on disciplinary grounds and those who are known to have been involved in acts of crime and gross indiscipline or misconduct will not be eligible for admission. The University may approach the police for verification in this regard. After admission if any body found guilty in this regard will have to discontinue the course.
- 1.13.2 The medium of examination shall be either Hindi or English for all the courses.
- 1.13.3 Admission will be granted to the candidates at their own risk and responsibility as per details furnished by them. If, at any time, it is noticed that the admission has been obtained by giving incorrect or false information or concealing information or oversight, the admission granted will be cancelled and the candidate shall be asked to leave the University.
- 1.13.4 All the candidates must submit attested copies of the following documents along with the application form and also produce original documents at the time of admission test.
 - 1.13.4.1 Marks sheet of the qualifying examination.
 - 1.13.4.2 Proof of Date of Birth.
 - 1.13.4.3 Character certificate from the Institute last attended.
 - 1.13.4.4 Bonafide SC / ST certificate, if applicable.
 - 1.13.4.5 Bonafide OBC certificate, if applicable (issued within six month)
 - 1.13.4.6 Sports Participation/Sports Merit Certificate.
- 1.13.5 All admitted students will have to submit Migration/Transfer Certificate from their respective Universities/Boards latest by 30, September 2010 in the Academic Section of this University.
- 1.13.6 Physical performance tests during admission process may involve risk of injury or physical strain. The University does not take any responsibility in the event of any such eventuality.
- 1.13.7 Failed candidates in the entrance test and ineligible candidates even after passing the entrance test shall not be eligible for admission.

1.14 SELECTION OF CANDIDATES

All the 'eligible candidates' shall be provisionally selected based upon performance in admission test strictly in the order of merit. Further, they will be required to undergo a medical test to be conducted by the University. All those who are certified as medically fit by the University's Doctors, will be finally admitted.

1.15 PAYMENT OF FEES

The finally selected candidates shall be required to pay fee as directed in accordance with **Annexure IV to IX** as the case may be. In case, any student fails to deposit fee within the stipulated period, his/her admission shall stand cancelled and other candidates from the waiting list will be considered for admission purely on merit basis.

1.16 SELF SUPPORTING SCHEME/PAYMENT SEATS

The University has kept certain seats reserved under the category of self-supporting scheme also known as payment seats mentioned for each course under departmental details. Further, the seats under self-supporting scheme will be made available only to those candidates who qualify in the admission test but fail to be selected under regular seats. Seats under this scheme will be filled up purely on merit basis among those who opt for the said scheme.

1.17 ATTENDANCE, CAUTION MONEY AND EXAMINATION

1.17.1 Regulations regarding attendance, examinations and results are to be strictly followed by the students as prescribed in the relevant ordinance and also announced from time to time by the University. The University expects 100 % attendance from the students in each subject/activity/area of the total curriculum but due to medical leave/social engagements leave/personal leave etc., a relaxation of 15 % is given.

1.17.2 The students are expected to maintain excellent conduct inside and outside the University as well as in the hostels. They will be supplied a copy of the University rules on admission. Breach of University rules may result in disciplinary action including expulsion from the University and the University reserves the right to make changes in the rules at any time, which will be notified to the students for their compliance.

1.17.3 Students involved in gross misconduct and found guilty by the disciplinary committee may not be considered as eligible to represent the LNUPE teams in Inter-Varsity and other sports competitions for a duration of one year.

1.17.4 Refund of caution money (if left due) shall be made by the University only after the declaration of final result of the course. In case, a student fails to complete the course within a stipulated time, the caution money shall be refunded.

1.17.5 In case, any student discontinues the course in between, his/her fee shall be refunded as applicable under the rules.

1.17.6 Students are advised to visit notice boards regularly, displayed at different places pertaining to academic matters.

1.18 UNIFORM

Uniform shall be purchased on actual cost basis under the guidance of respective department.

1.19 SPORTS EQUIPMENTS

All students have to procure personal equipments as specified for different games/sports at their own cost, depending upon the activity schedule, for instance, rackets for badminton, table tennis, and squash, hockey stick, cricket bat, judo dress, swimming costume etc.

1.20 WINTER CLOTHING

During winter, Gwalior is cold with temperature range between 5^o C to 12^o C during December and January, Hence, all the students are advised to bring sufficient warm clothing.

1.21 SCHOLARSHIPS AND FREESHIPS

1.21.1 Sports Scholarship

The University awards a number of sports scholarships to those students who win medals in the All India Inter-Varsity tournaments in a particular academic year. The amount of scholarships is Rs. 15000/- per year. The scholarships shall be tenable for one year. during the year of achievement, and shall be subject to satisfactory conduct in the University.

The University, also award cash prizes of Rs. 1000, Rs. 800 and Rs. 500 to the students securing First, second and third positions respectively in All India Inter- varsity tournaments.

1.21.2 Tuition Free ship

All the female students of B.P.Ed. Integrated course are exempted from the tuition fee of Rs. 4000/- annually, provided they pass the examinations and maintain good conduct.

1.21.3 Merit Scholarship

This is awarded to all top 10% students of every class of B.P.Ed. Integrated and M.P.Ed. courses getting ranking in their annual examinations @ 4,000/- per students for one year.

1.21.4 Fellowship for M.Phil. Scholars

Rs. 1000/- per month will be awarded to the top five M.Phil. scholars based upon their performance in the entrance test for admission in M.Phil. course who do not receive any kind of financial help from any other source (including salary) and is subject to satisfactory conduct both within and outside the university.

1.21.5 Other Scholarships

Some States and Union Territories Governments offer scholarships to their students: Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Lakshadweep, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Pondichery, Punjab, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal offer scholarship only to SC/ST students. In addition, scholarships are also awarded by North East Council.

1.21.6 Prof. R.P. Sharma Scholarship

Rs. 1000/- each will be awarded to the best footballers (Men and Women) of the Institute annually by the family members of (Late) Prof. R.P. Sharma.

NOTE: Awards of any scholarship and freeship is liable to be withdrawn in case of unsatisfactory work or misconduct.

1.22 IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION

1.22.1 Those candidates whose results are not declared may apply, but they must produce their original marks sheet of the qualifying examination at the time of checking of certificates prior to the commencement of admission test. Or those candidates whose results are not declared may appear in the admission test with prior permission from the connect authors and must produce the original mark sheet by the 31st July 2010.

1.22.2 Candidates must wear proper kit for appearing in admission test.

1.22.3 Boarding and Lodging arrangements for the candidates shall be provided at L.N.U.PE. Gwalior only which is compulsory. Parents accompanying the wards shall make their own boarding and lodging arrangement outside the University. The Candidates reporting to other center except Gwalior shall be required to make their own boarding and lodging arrangement.

1.22.4 Boarding and lodging charges at LNUPE, Gwalior, for different courses shall be charged as follows: (Boarding @ Rs. 100 per day & Lodging @Rs. 50 per day) Hence, a candidate shall pay the following amount during testing days:

For Example:

B.P.Ed. (Integrated)	-RS. 600 for 4 days
M.P.Ed.	-RS. 300 for 2 days
PG Diploma Courses	-RS. 300 for 2 days
M. Phil.	-RS. 150 for 1 day

1.23 In Case of any discrepancies in the English & Hindi Version of the Prospectus, the English version will be authentic and valid.

1.24 The Institute shall offer Post Graduate Diploma Courses Subject to administrative feasibility.

1.25 This prospectus supersedes all previous issues.

1.26 The contents of this prospectus may be changed as per administrative decision in future.
